

Summary of current Pacific border restrictions by country at **8 May 2020**

Country	Cases (8/5)	Border restrictions
Samoa	No cases	<p>Border remains closed, including for nationals.</p> <p>Details: Air New Zealand granted approval to fly weekly CARGO ONLY flights into Samoa across May, from 8 May.</p>
Tonga	No cases	<p>Border remains closed, including for nationals.</p> <p>Details: A flight diversion order is in place until 12 June, blocking all but authorised flights from arriving; however, border restrictions are likely to be in place beyond this date.</p>
Fiji	8 cases	<p>Border is open to nationals but Nadi Airport is closed to international flights.</p> <p>Details: Exceptions have been made for foreign government's repatriation flights departing Nadi. All arriving passengers are subject to 28 day quarantine requirement.</p>
Vanuatu	No cases	<p>Border is open to nationals but incoming flights are not permitted except on an as-approved basis.</p> <p>Details: International commercial passenger flights have ceased in Vanuatu until further notice. Air Vanuatu has approval to operate fortnightly cargo flights, on a commercial basis subject to demand (but flights are yet to commence).</p>
PNG	8 cases	<p>Border is restricted, but entry is possible for nationals with some conditions.</p> <p>Details: Under Papua New Guinea's National State of Emergency (extended on 2 April for a further two months) no person is permitted to board an aircraft bound for PNG, unless granted an explicit exemption by the Emergency Controller. Limited commercial flights options are available (via Brisbane), providing Queensland transit requirements can be met. Self-funded 14 day quarantine is required for all arriving passengers. All inbound PNG citizens are required to liaise with the PNG High Commission.</p>

Kiribati	No cases	<p>Border remains closed, including for nationals.</p> <p>Details: No passenger flights inwards. Travellers from New Zealand must spend 14 days in a "country free of COVID-19" and provide a medical clearance confirming COVID-19 free status on day 14 prior to entering Kiribati.</p>
Solomon Islands	No cases	<p>Border is open to nationals, but currently no incoming passenger flights are permitted.</p> <p>Details: There have no flights scheduled since 27/3.</p>
Tuvalu	No cases	<p>All flights to Tuvalu are suspended.</p> <p>Details: If flights were to resume, anyone travelling from high-risk countries (including New Zealand and Australia) must undertake a 14 day period of self-isolation in a country other than those listed as high-risk, prior to entering Tuvalu. They must also obtain a medical clearance three days prior to entering Tuvalu.</p>
Nauru	No cases	<p>Border is open to nationals.</p> <p>Details: Air Nauru is operating 1x fortnightly service out of Brisbane, providing Queensland transit requirements can be met. No other services available. 14 day quarantine required on arrival.</p>
